

# FLORIDA SPECIFIC EQUIVALENCY FOR DOD/OUT OF STATE FIRE FIGHTERS

**<u>DESCRIPTION</u>**: This will be a 40-hour course with an additional 8 hours for state testing. This course will meet the requirements of 69A-37.055, Florida specific requirements for out of state or DOD applicants wishing to challenge the Florida State Exam.

Statewide emergency response plan, thermal imaging, positive pressure ventilation, company evolutions, air monitoring, firefighter safety and survival and new challenges will be covered per the statute.

<u>WHO SHOULD TAKE THIS CLASS:</u> This class is necessary for anyone in the military who did not take their firefighter standards in the state of Florida. This would include students challenging the state exam from the Department of Defense. This course is also for those who are certified Firefighters in other states besides Florida and need to get Florida Equivalency.

<u>DATES:</u> May 19<sup>th</sup> – May 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2024 <u>STATE TEST</u>: May 24<sup>th</sup>, 2024 <u>HOURS:</u> 0800 – 1700 each day

#### **PRE-REQUISITES**:

- Medical examination on state form DFS-K4-1022, and it must be dated within six months of the last day of class.
- Complete Structural Collapse Awareness, FEMA IS-100, IS-200, I-700 and IS-800 on-line and bring proof of completion. See page 3 for links to the online course work.
- Student must also bring their own Personal Protective Equipment with fixed labels indicating compliance with the current edition of NFPA 1971.
