

ABE/GED Class Schedules

Eligibility for online courses is determined by the reading score achieved on the initial placement test. Please note that students may choose either campus-based classes or online classes, but not both simultaneously.

- Complete Online Application at www.MarionTC.edu
BRAND NEW STUDENTS ONLY
- VALID State ID or Passport
- Social Security Card if applicable
- Withdrawal Form from the last educational institution you were enrolled.
(Under 18 only, or under 21 if you were enrolled in a K12 school as of last school year)
- Payment of \$67.25 (2.75% fee for credit/debit card payments) **OR** DCF FOSTER tuition waiver, Homeless letter from Agency (ex. Project Hope, Salvation Army) or an Agency Voucher (ex. Voc Rehab, Career Source).
- If the potential student is currently on probation or has had any bouts with the law since being enrolled in his/her last school, we need to be made aware of the offense and current status. If the student is currently on probation, the PO's full name and phone number will need to be added to the student's Permission to Release form. We may need to verify certain things before deciding what classes we can offer.

School Year Overview

The academic year at MTC runs from August to June, divided into two distinct terms. Each term requires a fee of \$67.25 for enrollment.

- Term 1 begins in August and concludes in December, coinciding with the winter break.
- Term 2 commences in January and finishes in June, aligning with the summer break.

We offer an open enrollment policy, allowing students to begin classes at any point during the current term. However, enrollment typically closes approximately one month before the term's concluding day.

Program Structure

Our program is self-paced, meaning students do not have a predetermined completion date.

- ABE/GED Students: Diplomas are awarded upon successful completion of all four GED tests available on GED.com.
- ESOL Students: Enrollment concludes when a student achieves a level 8 in both Reading & Listening on his/her post-test.

Post-Testing Requirement

Post-testing is a mandatory component for all Adult General Education (AGE) students at Marion Technical College. Students must complete post-testing after fulfilling the required instructional hours, which vary between ABE and ESOL classes. Students may post-test multiple times in a term. Failure to meet this requirement may hinder future enrollment in subsequent terms.
